

INFORMATION FOR THE ATHLETES JYVÄSKYLÄ MOTONET GP 2023



Accommodation

The official hotel for the athletes is hotel Verso (Kauppakatu 35, p. 014 333 999, www.hotelliverso.fi/en) or hotel Alba (<https://www.hotellialba.fi/en/>).

You have your / your athletes accommodation info attached in the email and you can see there where you are accommodated.

Competition office

Athletes who are accommodated in the competition hotels will get their accreditation cards and BIBs from the hotel reception.

Other athletes can get their accreditation cards and BIBs from the competition office. Competition office is open during the competition day in front of the stadium near warm-up area at 14.00–20.00.

Final confirmation

Withdrawal of any confirmed athlete must be indicated to the competition office in writing on the official withdrawal form 90 minutes before the events starting time or sending WhatsApp message to Oskari Eskola (+358440515118).

BIBs

Each athlete must wear the bibs on his/her front and event from 400 m and longer distances front and back.

Equipments

Personal implements will also be allowed, providing that:

- They are readily identifiable and are IAAF certified
- They are not already on the official list
- They have been checked for compliance with IAAF Rules
- They are made available to all other athletes until the end of the event

Personal implements will be checked at the implements control, which is located behind the call room. Personal implements must be at the control at least two hours before the competition.

Warm-up area

Warm-up area is located near Pitkätatu. There is mondo track, hurdles and blocks. Warm-up area for throws is in Viitaniemi (Eeronkatu 8).

Call room

Athletes arriving late may be excluded from participation in the event.

Call room is located under the grand stand near the finish line. All athletes must report to the Call Room before each event and will then be escorted to the competition site. A detailed Call Room timetable will be displayed in competition office and call room. Call Room closes for track events 20 minutes before event, for field events 35 minutes before (high jumps 45 minutes).

The following checks will be carried out on equipment that must comply with IAAF and Competition Rules:

- Competition clothing
- Shoes
- Non-authorized equipment (radio, ipod, mobile phone, camera, etc.) are not allowed to bring to the infield.

Access to the stadium

Each athlete and coach will receive an accreditation card. Athletes and coaches need the accreditation card to access the stadium. After the competition, athletes immediately leave the infield through the mixed zone where media interviews will be carried out.

Starter's Commands

The starter's commands will be given in English.

The starter's commands for the distances up to 400m are:

"On your marks" – "Set" – Fire of the gun.

For distances of 800m and over, the commands will be:

- "On your marks"- Fire of the gun.

If for any reason the starter feels it is necessary to interrupt the process, he/she will say:

- "Stand Up" or "Up".

Dressing Room

Dressing rooms with showers are located under the grandstand, near the call room, at the Stadium and will be accessible for all participants.

Weight lifting area

Athletes can use on Monday and Tuesday morning the weightlifting area, which is located under the grandstand at the stadium.

Leaving the stadium during and after the competition

An athlete may only leave the competition area when accompanied by a judge. The intention must be communicated to the Referee. After the competition, athletes immediately leave the infield through the mixed zone where media interviews will be carried out. Track athletes' clothes from the start will be carried to the mixed zone area.

Mixed Zone

Athletes are led out of the stadium through the mixed zone where media interviews will be carried out. Mixed zone is located near the finish lane at the end of the grand stand.

Scoreboard

Lanes and starting order are in the scoreboard, which is located next to the call room.

Results

Final results will be on the official scoreboard. Live results are also online at www.motonetgp.fi/jyvaskyla.

Victory Ceremonies

Winners will be strewed with flowers immediately after the competition.

Medical Service

The medical point will be located in the Stadium near the finish lane. There will also be first aid teams in the infield during the events. First aid persons are marked with green vests and white crosses.

Doping Control

Doping control shall be conducted in accordance with IAAF Rules and Procedures under the supervision of the Finnish Anti-doping association. **Athlete must have their ID or passport with them.**

Prize money

For prize money, travel and appearance send your bank details (bank account number, SWIFTH/BIC, bank's name and address, receivers name and address) and copy of your passport in advance to oskari.eskola@jku.fi.

Protest and Appeals

In the first instance, protests must be made orally to the Referee by the athlete himself/herself or by a responsible official acting on his/her behalf. Protest concerning the result or conduct of an event shall be made within 30 minutes of the official announcement of the result of that event. When submitting an appeal form, a deposit of 50€ must be paid. If the protest is unsuccessful, the deposit will not be returned. The Jury's decision will be provided in writing.
